THE AMERICAN FRENCH FILM FESTIVAL COMES TO THE DGA THEATER OCTOBER 29-NOVEMBER 3

LOS ANGELES: September 3, 2024 – *The American French Film Festival* (TAFFF) will hold its 28th annual edition and awards competition October 29-November 3 at the Directors Guild of America Theater on Sunset Boulevard in Hollywood.

Every year, The Franco American Cultural Fund brings the American French Film Festival to the city of Los Angeles with a star-studded, red carpet Opening Night celebration followed by five days of French films and TV series, many of which will be exhibited for the first time in the US. The festival also features cocktail receptions featuring French food, wine and specialty cocktails, audience awards, and the chance to win a trip to Paris for the full French experience!
